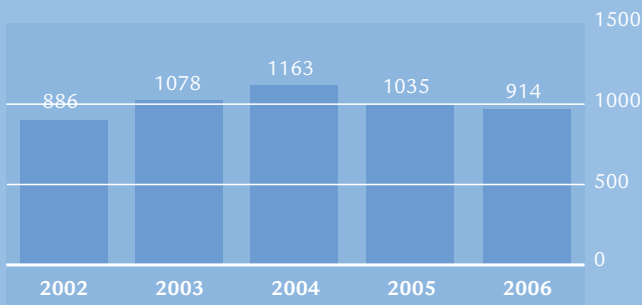

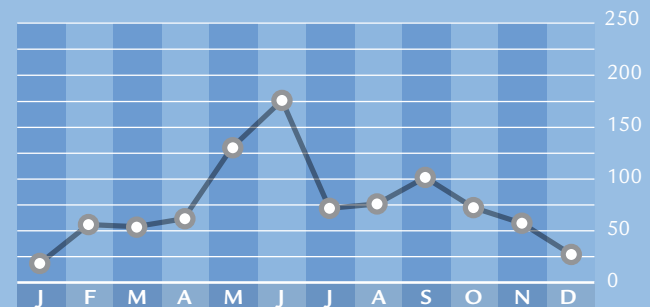

Evolution of *Criminal Code* misdemeanours and offences in 2006

A total of 137,081 *Criminal Code* misdemeanours and offences were reported in Montréal in 2006, which is a 1% increase over 2005.

The number of misdemeanours reported dropped by 12.4% since 2000 and 37.3% since 1991, when more than 218,000 *Criminal Code* offences were reported.

Crimes against persons

In 2006, 25,469 crimes against persons were reported for the territory, a decrease of 1,238 compared to 2005. Crimes of violence have slid every year in the past six years and, in 2006, the number of violent crimes was 19.5% lower than in 2000.

Homicides

The number of homicides increased, from 35 in 2005 to 43 in 2006. This number is well below Montréal's average of 65 homicides recorded per year since 1980.

Attempted murders

The number of attempted murders rose 11.3%, climbing from 141 in 2005 to 157 in 2006. This type of crime has grown 53.9% since 2001. The number of attempted murders in 2006 is the highest recorded in Montréal for the past decade.

Sexual assaults

A total of 1,694 sexual assaults were reported in 2006, which is 3.2% less than in 2005. This decrease is the first recorded since 2002.

Robberies and acts of extortion

The number of robberies and acts of extortion decreased 1.9% from 4,340 in 2005 to 4,259 in 2006. The number of robberies in Montréal has been virtually halved over the past 15 years.

Assaults

The number of assaults dropped 5.8%, declining from 14,027 in 2005 to 13,211 in 2006. This was the sixth year in a row in which a decline in assaults was recorded with the number having dropped 24.7% since 2000.

Crimes against property

Crimes against property dropped by 0.6%, declining from 97,268 in 2005 to 96,723 in 2006. The downward trend in crimes against property has persisted with a 15.9% decrease being recorded since 2000 and 44.8%, since 1991.

Arson

After having plummeted 21.2% in 2005 (769 misdemeanours) the number of acts of arson shot up 7% in 2006 (715 misdemeanours). The number of acts of arson has dropped 32.1% since 2000 and more than half over the past 15 years.

Breaking and entering

The number of incidents of breaking and entering recorded in Montréal (20,383 misdemeanours) grew 4.4% in 2006. This is the first increase after eight consecutive years of decreases. Burglaries have dropped 38.4% in the past decade. By comparison, the number of such incidents was 43,112 in 1991, more than twice as high as the figure for 2006.

In 2006, two out of three burglaries were committed in a residence. The number of home burglaries grew from 13,023 in 2005 to 14,051 in 2006, for an increase of 7.9%. Moreover, the number of home burglaries almost halved (48.3%) since 1991.

Motor vehicle thefts

The number of motor vehicle thefts slid 3.4% from 14,129 in 2005 to 13,644 in 2006. The situation has clearly improved over the years from 21,621 in 1997. This type of misdemeanour has since dropped more than a third (-36.9%).

Common thefts

Almost one third of all offences reported in Montréal in 2006 were common thefts. The number of common thefts decreased 0.9%, down from 44,253 in 2005 to 43,583 in 2006. Overall, the general downward trend has continued for 15 years: the number of common thefts in 2006 was 7.3% less than in 2000 and 41.1% less than in 1991.

Fraud

In 2006, the 5,583 acts of fraud that were reported represented a 0.9% increase compared to 2005. However, acts of fraud have slid 23.9% since 2002. There was a marked decline (14.5%) in the number of acts of fraud pertaining to ATM cards in 2006, and an overall drop (65.7%) since 2000.

Mischief

The number of acts of mischief declined 3.2%, dropping from 12,520 in 2005 to 12,115 in 2006. This number was 21.5% lower than in 2000 and dropped 53.4% since 1991, when 26,025 of these misdemeanours were recorded.

Other offences under the *Criminal Code*

The number of crimes committed in the "other offences under the *Criminal Code*" category jumped 26.1% in 2006. Among these misdemeanours is a noticeable increase in prostitution-related offences (19.7%), offences against the administration of justice (30.2%) and fire-arm offences (53.7%).
