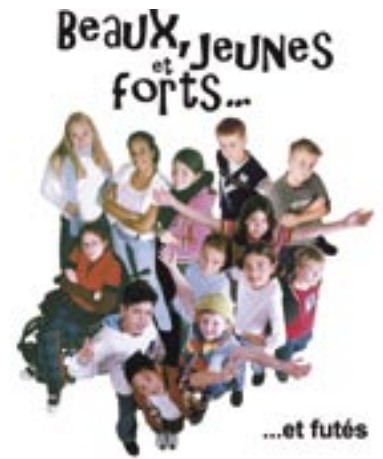

## ANSWERS

### Question 1

---

*In Canada, police officers are the people who enforce the laws and punish criminals for breaking the law.*

**True.** In Canada, police officers are the people who enforce the laws. The courts decide whether or not you broke the law and how you should be punished.

### Question 2

---

*When I'm riding my bike and I come to a stop sign at the street corner, I should slow down to see whether there is a car coming.*

**False.** On a bike just like in a car, you have to completely stop at the stop sign and check in both directions before crossing.

### Question 3

---

*After school a friend asks me to go to his house to play. It's OK for me to go because it's just for a little while.*

**False.** If you are invited to a friend's house after school, you should always tell your parents or the adult responsible for you after school. If you don't, they'll get worried and think something bad happened to you. They'll start looking for you and might even contact the police to help find you.

### Question 4

---

*The role of the school crossing guard is just to make sure school kids are polite and well behaved.*

**False.** The school crossing guard has a very important job. Besides being responsible for your safety when you cross at dangerous intersections, they also teach you to cross the street carefully and safely so you will become a responsible pedestrian. The school crossing guard can also help you if you're in trouble. So feel free to turn to your crossing guard if you feel that you're in danger!

### Question 5

---

*A kid in your class tells another kid to give him his jacket and threatens to hit him if he doesn't. This is called taxing.*

**True.** Taxing is actually robbery, and "taxers" can be arrested by the police. If you or a friend have been taxed, it's important for you to tell a grownup you trust as quickly as possible so you can stop being afraid. If you don't tell, you'll probably be targeted again. Grownups know about taxing and they know how to stop it.

### Question 6

---

*I should always take the safe routes I have discussed with my parents, even if I'm late. I should avoid parks, alleyways and deserted areas.*

**True.** You should always take the safest route, even if it takes longer. You should avoid parks, alleyways, woods and deserted areas. You and your parents should also find places where you could ask for help: stores, restaurants.

### Question 7

---

*When someone is a bully, it's usually because they need to boss other people and show they have power over them.*

**True.** Bullying is when someone physically or mentally pesters and bothers another person over and over again, like wrecking their belongings, telling lies about them or pushing them around. Bullies want to prove that they are stronger or better than the people they hurt. So actually, bullies need help too! If you are being bullied, talk to someone you trust: a parent, a teacher, etc.

### Question 8

---

*I should never answer questions from a stranger. I should never give a stranger my name, address or any other personal information.*

**True.** If a stranger tries to talk to you, you should keep your distance. You don't have to answer. You should never give them your personal information (name, address, parents' names...). You should be prepared to drop your stuff (like your backpack) in order to run away faster. If a stranger grabs you, you should scream to attract attention. You should fight the person by kicking and punching.
