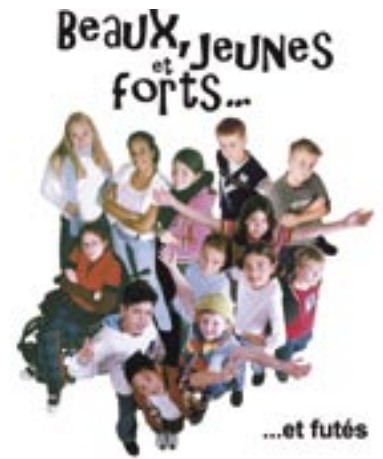

ANSWERS

Question 1

In Canada, the laws are set by the federal government in Ottawa. Everyone in Canada has to obey the "Criminal Code."

True. The Criminal Code is a document that police officers use to enforce the laws. Police officers enforce the laws that were made to make sure our society works well.

Question 2

Children 11 and under can ride their bikes on roads where the speed limit is 50 km/h or less.

True. If you are 11 or under, you can ride your bike on any road with a speed limit of 50 km/h or less. The rule doesn't apply if you are with an adult or if you're on a protected bicycle path.

Question 3

There is an article in the Criminal Code that clearly defines bullying as unacceptable under the law.

True. Article 423.1 of the Criminal Code clearly defines this behaviour. Bullying is a crime! To stop bullying, we have to talk about it. Tell an adult about what is happening.

Question 4

"Taxers" often go around in small groups and they generally attack people who are stronger than them.

False. They usually attack people who are smaller than them and people who are alone. If you are ever taxed, try to stay calm and give your attackers whatever they ask for. Don't fight. Your life is more important than whatever it is they want! Take a close look at them so you can describe them clearly when you tell a grownup what happened.

Question 5

I'm surfing on the Internet and someone I've been chatting with for a few weeks asks me to meet them at a park near my house. It's OK for me to go meet them because I know it's a person my age who wants to be my friend.

False. You must ask permission from your parents before you go meet someone you met on the Internet. This kind of meeting should always take place in a public area and with one of your parents.

Question 6

People aren't allowed to drink while they are driving.

True. It is against the law to drink on the public roads or to drive while impaired. People whose ability to drive is impaired because of alcohol or other drugs are not allowed to drive their cars. They can be arrested for "impaired driving."

Question 7

If I come home and see that the door is standing open or a window is broken, I shouldn't go in.

True. You should go to a neighbour's house and call the police.

Question 8

People associate graffiti with violence.

True. People associate graffiti with violence and that makes them feel unsafe. The places where we see graffiti tend to be dilapidated and poorly lit. These are often the places where certain kinds of crimes are committed. Graffiti can ruin the view and actually reduce the quality of life for you and your family!
